Every child welfare agency can...



Educate

- Educate staff, mental health professionals, and other organizations on topics such as:
 - o Gender identity
 - Two-Spirit/Native LGBTQ+
 - o Transgender 101
 - Suicide Prevention
- Develop and/or establish a curriculum for Native foster parents of Two-Spirit and/or Native LGBTQ+ youth.
- Receive safe-zone training as an organization.
- Provide basic living skills training to youth.
- Host a gathering to encourage individual, family, and community healing.

Display Affirming Materials

- Share pictures of same-sex foster parent couples.
- Display campaigns and posters throughout the organization.

Create an Awareness Campaign

• Work with individuals that identity to create and distribute a campaign that raises awareness about Two-Spirit/Native LGBTQ+ identities.

Form an Inclusive and Diverse Board

• Invite Two-Spirit and/or Native LGBTQ+ leaders from within your community to be a part of your advisory board.

Establish a Mentoring Program

- Create a program that engages older Two-Spirit and/or Native LGBTQ+ individuals to mentor youth. By doing so, youth can also learn about culture and spirituality, and the history of the Two-Spirit identity before colonization.
- Assist and encourage youth in building relationships with elders in the community.

Collect Data

• Encourage tribes and agencies to collect data specific to Two-Spirit/LGBTQ youth.

Engage Same-Sex Families

- Engage, welcome, encourage, and support same-sex families in your community to become foster parents.
- Establish opportunities for same-sex families to offer respite, friendship, support, and mentorship to youth who may identify and their families.

Provide Support Resources

- Collaborate with other agencies to share resources.
- Provide staff with support resources to share with youth who may identify.

Create Policies and Procedures

- Create policies in regards to the protection and non-discrimination of Two-Spirit and/or Native LGBTQ+ individuals and **display** the policy.
- Encourage tribal communities to develop codes to protect adults and youth who identify as Two-Spirit and/or Native LGBTQ+.

Check Biases

- As an organization, check your bias and the bias that staff may bring to the workplace.
- Discuss bias with staff.
